# **FRIENDS** of Indiana Dunes Updates

The FRIENDS have had a busy 2023. We started the year hoping to raise enough donations to complete the rehab of the Indiana Dunes State Park's Trail 8 and create an accessible trail through the Great Marsh. We are happy to say by early Summer 2023 the boardwalk portion of Trail 8 over the marsh with its numerous bump-outs was completed. Now a mobility challenged visitor can take an enjoyable walk or ride on a FRIENDS' purchased ATV on the Trail 8 boardwalk. There are also plenty of places to stop or pull off the trail to view the numerous waterfowl and birds that frequent the Great Marsh.

In May the FRIENDS were able to bring three Polish National Park staff to the dunes to participate in the Indiana Dunes Birding Festival. During the visit, the representative from Poland's Kampinoski National Park re-signed the sister park agreement with Indiana Dunes National Park. The FRIENDS were delighted to take part in this monumental event as 25 years earlier we sponsored the Kampinoski staff who visited for the signing of the original sister park agreement.

This year the Dunes Learning Center celebrated their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary. At their Annual Gala, the Learning Center recognized the efforts of their former Director Geof Benson and recently retired National Park Superintendent Paul Labovitz by bestowing upon them the Founders Award. The FRIENDS are happy to provide funding to cover the costs of their American Camp Association Accreditation as well as help provide educational and fun experiences for school children who might not otherwise have an opportunity to visit the dunes.



The FRIENDS continue to support animals at the Chellberg Farm. This year the FRIENDS have taken on the financial support of the resident chickens and developed an innovative fundraising program - "Adopt a Flock of Chickens" – to help cover these additional costs. For a \$50 donation to the FRIENDS, you get bragging rights to either the red or green banded flock of chickens, a personalized adoption certificate, and the satisfaction of helping to keep animals on the farm.

The FRIENDS have worked with the Indiana Dunes National Park to create a wide range of fundraising programs. To start with, we are now asking dog owners to donate \$5.00 to the FRIENDS for each Indiana Dunes National Park Bark Ranger Tag they request. Also, the wonderful vegetables grown in the Chellberg Farm Garden are placed in the FRIENDS Produce Stand located in the parking lot adjacent to our office. We suggest a nominal donation for the various items (tomatoes, peppers, squash, onions, melons, and even flowers). Lastly, the addition of Maple Syrup created from the sap collected at Maple Sugar Time is also available for a donation to the FRIENDS. This year we ran out of syrup by mid-June due to the high demand. We are hoping for a good sap run this coming March 2024.

Thank you to all who donated funds for a Chellberg Farm raised turkey. We have received numerous reports on how tasty they were. The predominately grass-fed Herefords will be available in mid-February 2024. FRIENDS members will be able to get parcels of 20 pounds of ground beef for \$7.50/pound while non-members will need to donate \$9.00/pound. If interested, please call 219-707-3617.

This November the FRIENDS offered a Basket Making Field Course at the Indiana Dunes State Park Nature Center. The course was full, and all the participants wanted to know when we would be offering another. Future Field Courses are in the planning stages so watch for details in future Dunes Echo newsletters. On November 26, our Vice-Chair Paul Stofko of Running Legs Race Series hosted a 5K run and Turkey Toss at Hawthorne Park in Porter with all proceeds going to the FRIENDS. Join us at the Nature Center for some OWL-iday cheer with Humane Indiana Wildlife's live owl ambassadors. Director Nicole Harmon will introduce to visitors 5 native species of Indiana Dunes. She will be showcasing a screech owl, barred owl, great-horned owl, snowy owl and barn owl and talking about their interesting adaptations and characteristics! Visitors will be able to enjoy up-close views of these nocturnal creatures. Arriving early is encouraged as space inside the auditorium and car parking is limited.

### Creature Feature on Tuesday-Friday, December 26-29 at 10:30am

Every weekday morning join the Naturalist at the Nature Center and be introduced to a different animal that calls the Indiana Dunes home. This is a time to get up-close views, selfies, and learn about their unique adaptations to survive in our diverse dunes' habitats.


